A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AWARDBID #2016-2017-002, GENERATOR REPLACEMENT ON FOSTER ROAD TO THE LOWEST RESPONSIVE RESPONSIBLE BIDDER, CANSECO ELECTRICAL CONTRACTORS, INC. IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED ONE HUNDRED TWENTY SIX THOUSAND (\$126,000.00) DOLLARS; AUTHORIZING A FIVE PERCENT (5%) CONTINGENCY FOR UNFORESEEN CIRCUMSTANCES: AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT TO EFFECTUATE THE PROJECT; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 23, Section 23-4, Competitive Bidding Required, all purchases of and contracts for equipment, supplies and contractual services, when the estimated cost shall exceed \$50,000.00 shall be based on competitive bids. Furthermore, pursuant to Chapter 23, Section 23-6 Award of Contract, the City Manager, shall have the authority to recommend to the City Commission award of contracts; and

WHEREAS, the City relies on Florida Power and Light (FP&L) for its primary source of electrical power. The City has emergency backup systems in order to ensure reliability and continuation of services to its residents; and

WHEREAS, these backup systems monitor the utility power from FP&L and automatically start a generator when they sense a power failure from the primary source; and

WHEREAS, the Hepburn Center and Lift Station No. 9 shared one 200 kilowatt generator as their emergency backup power system. The Hepburn Center was recently demolished to make way for the new OB Johnson Park, which has its own standalone emergency backup power system; and

WHEREAS, on March 14, 2017, the City Administration released Bid #FY2016-2017-002 Generator Replacement on Foster Road; and

WHEREAS, Bid #FY2016-2017-002 was advertised in the Hallandale Beach Chamber of Commerce website, City website, DemandStar Website, the Miami Minority Business Development Agency Business Center, the U.S. Small Business Administration, and the Broward

44 **WHEREAS**, on March 22, 2017, a mandatory pre-bid conference and site visit was held
45 at 11:00 am, and seven (7) vendors and five (5) staff members attended the meeting, with
46 responses to the Bid due on April 13, 2017

48 **WHEREAS**, there were three (3) proposals received from Canseco Electrical Contractors,
49 Inc., Braggs & Hayes, Inc./D Electrician Technical Services, Inc. and All Florida Contracting
50 Services, LLC; and

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52 **WHEREAS**, Canseco Electrical Contractors were the lowest responsive bid at one
53 hundred twenty six thousand (\$126,000.00) dollars; and

55 **WHEREAS**, the City Administration recommends that the City Commission award Bid FY
56 #2016-2017-002, Generator Replacement on Foster Road, to the lowest responsive responsible
57 bidder, Canseco Electrical Contractors, Inc. in an amount not to exceed one hundred twenty six
58 thousand (\$126,000.00) dollars, and authorizing a five percent (5%) contingency for unforeseen
59 circumstances, and authorizing the City Manager to execute an agreement to effectuate the
60 project; and

62 **WHEREAS**, the Mayor and City Commission have determined that the City
63 Administration's recommendations are in the best interest of the City and its residents.

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65 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF**
66 **THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:**

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68 **SECTION 1. City Commission Action.** The Mayor and City Commission hereby award
69 Bid FY #2016-2017-002, Generator Replacement on Foster Road, to the lowest responsive
70 responsible bidder, Conseco Electrical Contractors, Inc.

72 **SECTION 2. City Manager Authorization.** The Mayor and City Commission hereby
73 authorize the City Manager to execute an agreement with Canseco Electrical Contractors, Inc. for
74 the Generator Replacement on Foster Road in an amount not to exceed one hundred twenty six
75 thousand (\$126,000.00) dollars, and authorizing a five percent (5%) contingency for unforeseen
76 circumstances. The City Manager is further authorized to execute all related documents to

77 effectuate this project.

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79 **SECTION 3. Effective Date.** This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its
80 passage and adoption.

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
